

The segments displaying particular strength in Carinthia receive targeted funding to help secure sustained competitiveness. This also includes massive investment in Research & Development, e.g. through the establishment and development of research facilities and centres of competence.





# Research

### Top R&D rates.

Carinthia has boosted its research rate by over 25 percent since 2002 – easily the strongest rate of growth in Austria! With R&D as a percentage of GDP at 2.56 %, Carinthia occupies the number three slot in Austria. Europe-wide, Carinthia is amongst the top 30 regions for Research & Development in the EU. (Source: IV-Kärnten, IHS business trends report – Issue 2/09)

### **Technology location Carinthia.**

Carinthia has enjoyed dynamic economic growth in recent years, thanks in large part to the numerous innovations and research achievements of the companies and research facilities located here. They have, in turn, been helped by the targeted establishment of research facilities in Carinthia's segments of particular economic strength and by introducing companies to research facilities and specialised competence centres.

### Carinthia's research facilities and centres of competence.

The research facilities and centres of competence – which are extremely well equipped both technically and financially – are in Carinthia's segments of particular economic strength:

- CTR Carinthian Tech Research Centre of competence for intelligent sensor technology
  - Areas of research: optical systems technology, photonic microsystems technology, SAW (Surface Acoustic Wave) sensor systems
- KAI Centre of competence for automotive and industrial electronics
  - Areas of research: high temperature electronics, electronic components for the automotive industry
- W3C Wood Carinthian Competence Center
  - Areas of research: surface technologies, process optimisation, spectroscopic applications, production and logistics in the wood industry
- O Lakeside Labs a platform for information and communications technology
  - Areas of research: mobile telephony, multimedia technologies, signals processing, "self-organizing networked systems"

In addition to developing the existing research facilities, further centres of competence are being planned. One key project in the short term will be the establishment of a centre of competence for the area of renewable energy, for example.

### Company-owned R&D centres.

Another key area of activity is in the company-owned R&D facilities of Carinthian enterprises. In recent years the Carinthian subsidiaries of multinational corporations have repeatedly been awarded the internal contract for the establishment of an R&D centre at the Carinthian location. This strengthens the position of the subsidiary itself, and equally the position of Carinthia as a location for research, technology and innovation. Examples include:

- Infineon Technologies Austria is developing power electronics for the automotive and other sectors in its Automotive R&D Center in Carinthia.
- Mahle Filtersysteme Austria won the internal tender to set up a Mechatronics Centre and is conducting research into mechatronics and plastics technologies for the automotive sector.


# Education

### Motivated people.

The Carinthian workforce is extremely well educated and highly motivated. A major point in Carinthia's favour is that its education system includes extensive language teaching – above all of English, Italian and Slovenian – as well as offering excellent technical skills training. A point which finds great favour with foreign investors.

Flexible working models make it possible to react quickly to changing market conditions. Moderate employment costs, a very low level of strikes, flexible daily/weekly working times (maximum working hours of 12 hours per day/60 hours per week) are some of the main reasons why foreign investors are so interested in Carinthia and Austria.

### Dynamic partnerships.



### Time is money.

- A high-quality transport, information and telecommunications infrastructure makes it possible to move goods and to communicate at great speed.




### Tax incentives.

In addition to the subsidy opportunities, Carinthia and Austria offer advantages over other markets in the area of taxation as well, including:

- Company taxation rate of 25 percent throughout Austria
- No trade tax or capital tax
- Tax allowance of up to 35 percent on R&D
- Tax allowance of up to 20 percent on training and development measures for employees

In this safe environment they can take advantage of the wide range of leisure opportunities.


